

Summary Files Made Simple

Basic Census geography from largest to smallest: Census Tract, Census Block Group, Census Block

Summary File 1 (SF 1)

286 tables that focus on age, sex, households, families, & housing units, with data by race and Hispanic origin, including data for American Indian tribes & groups within race categories. *GEOGRAPHY*: Nation down to Census Block level. Data from the 2000 Census short form.

Summary File 2 (SF 2)

47 tables that focus on age, sex, households, families, and occupied housing units for the total population and for 249 detailed population groups. *GEOGRAPHY*: Nation down to Census Tract level. Data from the 2000 Census short form.

Summary File 3 (SF 3)

813 tables consisting of 484 population tables and 329 housing tables. *GEOGRAPHY*: Nation down to the Census Block Group level. Data from the 2000 Census long form.

Summary File 4 (SF 4)

323 tables consisting of 213 population tables and 110 housing tables. *GEOGRAPHY*: Nation down to the Census Tract level. Data from the 2000 Census long form.

Smallest geography for each Summary File:

SF 1 - census block

SF 3 - census block group

SF 2 - census tract

SF 4 - census tract

"Summary Files Made Simple" Summary File #3 contain sample data for 30 of Oklahoma's largest tribes. Summary File #4 contains data for all tribes that have at a population of at least 100.
